Bamburi targets 1,600 masons in training

Cement maker Bamburi has started training 1,600 masons across the country to address the shortage of skilled workers in the building and construction industry.

The training is already under way in areas such as Nyeri, Migori, Embu, Chuka, Meru and Maua.

"The main objective is to enhance masons' skills and professionalism by offering formal training to promote safe construction and job creation in the country," said the company in a statement yesterday.

Beneficiaries will be trained on

site planning, drawings, setting out and foundations, mix designs, causes of building defects including on site safety procedures.

"This programme seeks to improve the vocational skills of masons, who are key players in the construction value chain, thus enhancing quality and safety of buildings. The masons are trained by engineers who have practical experience in construction," said Irene Onacha the Bamburi Cement Marketing Director.

So far the company has trained over 500 masons and foremen since the programme started.

The companysaid it would spread the training to areas such as Kitale, Kisumu, Eldoret, Siaya, Bungoma, Nakuru, Webuye, Ol Kalau, Malindi, Mombasa and Ukunda next month. The programme was introduced 12 years ago.

It said it would partner with the National Construction Authority to train more artisans.

Companies as well as non-governmental organisations have of late introduced technical training courses to address the biting deficit of qualified masons, painters and architects.





Over 1, 800 masons benefit from Bamburi training



Bamburi Cement has this year trained 1,859 masons, in a move aimed at improving construction quality standards in the country.

Many masons or 'fundis' as they are popularly known, lack formal training and the initiative launched by Bamburi twelve years ago, aims at enhancing their skills and professionalism.

"This program seeks to improve the vocational skills of masons, who are key players in the construction value chain thus enhancing quality and safety of buildings. The masons are trained by engineers who have practical experience in construction," said Ms. Susan Maingi, Bamburi Cement Corporate Affairs and Communications Director.

The Kenya Economic Survey 2014 projects that the construction sector will continue to remain robust after expanding by 5.5 per cent up from 4.8 per cent registered in 2012, underlining the need for more well-trained masons.

Beneficiaries are trained on site planning, drawings, setting out and foundations, mix designs, causes of building defects and how to avoid them.

They are also trained in site safety procedures.

The training seminars are held on Sundays in market centers around the country.

"Since inception twelve years ago, in Kenya alone we have visited over 200 market centers and villages around the country. We have held over 500 seminars and interacted with more than 250,000 masons" she concluded.
