Flooding, Covid-19 pandemic sink South Sudan oil production revenues, affect fiscal budget

South Sudan's oil production has reduced from the previous 170,000 barrels a day to the current 156,000 bpd amid negative impacts of Covid-19 and heavy flooding since 2020, Finance minister Agak Achuil Lual said Wednesday. Tabling the 2021/22 fiscal budget before the transitional national legislative assembly, Mr Lual said South Sudan earned \$1.4 billion in gross oil revenues of which \$1.1 billion went to direct transfers, \$148 million paid to Sudan as cost for processing, transportation and transit fees. Juba projected to collect \$135 million in non-oil revenues in this fiscal year, an increase of 31.1 percent from \$103 million in 2020/21. "The projected increase is on account of the tax administration reforms at the national revenue authority, including digitisation of collections and broadening the tax base." ■ XINHUA

Bamburi opts for cheaper and cleaner solar energy

Bamburi Cement plans to source a portion of its power supply from solar plants to cut costs and reduce the impact of electricity outages. It has signed a power purchase deal with Momnai Energy Ltd to set up two solar plants adjacent to its Mombasa and Nairobi factories targeting to generate 14.5MW at Mombasa and 5MW in Nairobi. This will be 40 percent of Bamburi's total power supply cutting its electricity bill by 10 percent or \$5.24 million per annum. ELIZABETH KIVUVA

The Tanzanian business community is apprehensive of planned power rationing by Tanzania Electric Supply Company (Tanesco), saying this would adversely affect their operations. They urged Tanesco to prioritise provision of electricity to manufacturing companies to maintain productivity. Kenyan banks gear up to announce record profits

Kenyan banks earned a cumulative \$1.56 billion in the 11 months to November. This sets them up for record profits for the year as they cut provisioning for bad loans as the economy recovers. The earnings are a 66 percent increase over the \$941.4 million they earned in the 11 months to November 2020, data from Central Bank of Kenya shows. Lenders had already surpassed the previous full-year record gross profit (\$1.39b made in 2019) in October. CHARLES MWANIKI

What were the creators of this series smoking? William Hanna and Joseph


